



## PARKING REGULATIONS

1. The front lot will likely fill up early so be prepared to drive around the school to the back lot. Don't be tardy to class.
2. **Visitor parking, staff parking (yellow stripes) and reserved parking are off limits. You will receive a \$20 parking fine for parking in those spots (for each offense).**
3. This privilege is available to seniors and juniors as space allows. Students must have **all fines paid** in order to purchase a parking permit.
4. **You must have a current, valid driver's license – a copy of your driver's license must be attached to your Parking Form. School staff is not allowed to make copies for you.**
5. The Parking Permit must be displayed in the front center of the windshield – hanging from the rear-view mirror.
6. Parking spaces are not assigned. Parking is festival style. Spots close to the entrance will fill up first. Car must be parked correctly within the allowed parking space and only in the space assigned.
7. There can be no re-sale or gifting of parking permits. You will lose your right to park on campus.
8. Students who withdraw from Mount Si High School must return their Parking Permit as part of the withdrawal process.
9. A student may not trade Permits with another student.
10. If a student gets a new car, the information must be reported to the Main Office and recorded on another Vehicle Registration form.

## PARKING PERMITS

Parking fee is \$30 per semester.

Students who wish to park on campus must complete Vehicle Registration form. When student has the form completed with signature of parent/guardian, and attached a copy of their valid driver's license, the student can purchase their pass during Wildcat Days.

**Students will need to pay all fines before purchasing a parking permit.**

Parking permits will be renewable for second semester upon payment in January, provided student has paid all other fines and fees.

**Parking off campus is limited. Students may not park in private driveways or lots, including nearby churches. Cars may be towed if parked illegally. Valuable possessions should not be brought to school to be left in parked vehicles or in school lockers. There is not school insurance coverage for student vehicles or their contents. Private vehicles used for student transportation can be subject to search by school authorities.**
